




Our Approach

With clients regularly including children experiencing Autism Spectrum Disorder, the Greenville Kindergarten and Day Care Centre playground demonstrates Sequential Outdoor Learning principles, creating a therapeutic play environment in an increasingly complex sequence.

Play areas are arranged to allow children to manage their own progress from one play experience to another, with transition spaces between.

The renovation of the play area took advantage of existing site features such as trees to create new play experiences, and introduced new opportunities to play with loose natural materials.

New play elements included a Bamboo Dome, trike circuit, freeform sandpit, vine-covered Catenary Screen, Rope Curtain, raised veggie garden, and balancing boulders through a path of tussock- forming grasses.

Provision has been made for staff to create an everchanging play experience, as they decorate the spaces with movable play items.



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
